REPORT OF TOPIC CHAIRMAN TRAINING & SERVICES TOPIC AREA

Development in broadcast media is quite fast and a lot of innovations and new technologies are being introduced at a rapid pace. Diversified technologies, wide variety of equipment and innovative services, etc. increase training demands in many folds. Under such scenario and limited resources, ABU Technology Division has been facing a tough challenge to meet the training needs of its member countries.

2) The Training & Services Topic Area plays an important role in developing technical skills and knowledge of ABU members. Under this Topic Area following project topics have been identified:

- i) Technical Training Priorities and Members Requirements (TS/TTPMR)
- ii) Skill Development Programme for Managerial, and Occupational Safety (TS/ SDPMOS)
- iii) Technical Skill Building and Knowledge Sharing (TS/TSBKS) OR High-Tech Exposure & Knowledge Sharing (TS/TEKS)

3) The TOR has already defined tasks and deliverables under each project topics. Most of these tasks are continuous in nature and are to be carried out periodically. ABU Technology Division has been working on these tasks continuously. The outcome in respect of each task during the period Dec 2021 to Nov 2022 has been consolidated and the same is enclosed as **Annexure-1**.

4) Within limited available time and resources, it may not be feasible to address all the tasks and deliverables. In order to achieve a realistic target, following deliverables are proposed to be undertaken in the next year:
