



Kuala Lumpur is the capital of Malaysia. The city serves as the cultural, financial, political and economic centre of Malaysia. Since the 1990s, the city has played host to many international sporting, political and cultural events, including the 1998 Commonwealth Games and the 2017 Southeast Asian Games. Kuala Lumpur has undergone rapid development in recent decades and is home to the tallest twin buildings in the world, the Petronas Towers, which have since become an iconic symbol of Malaysian development. Kuala Lumpur is well connected with neighbouring urban metro regions such as Petaling Jaya via the rapidly expanding Klang Valley Integrated Transit System. Residents of the city can also travel to other parts of Peninsular Malaysia as well as to Kuala Lumpur International Airport (KLIA) via rail through KL Sentral.

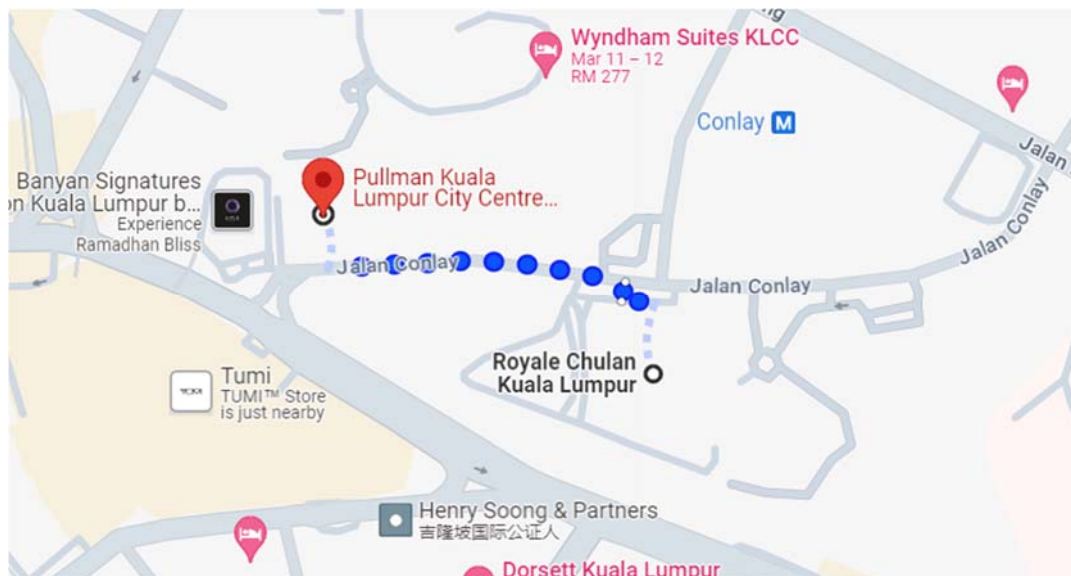
## Conference Location

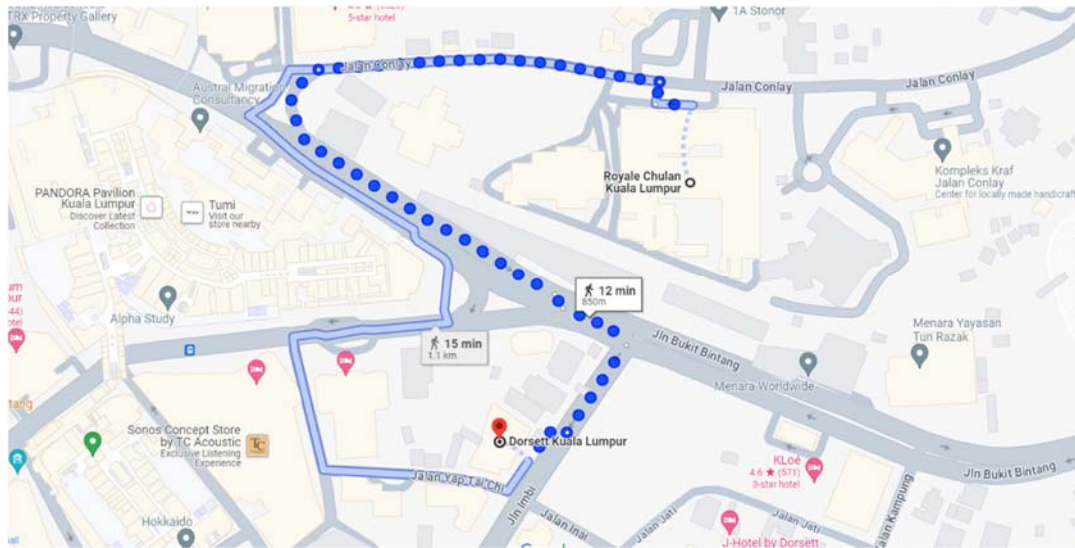
## Nearby Accommodation

The conference venue also nearby some well-known hotel such as:

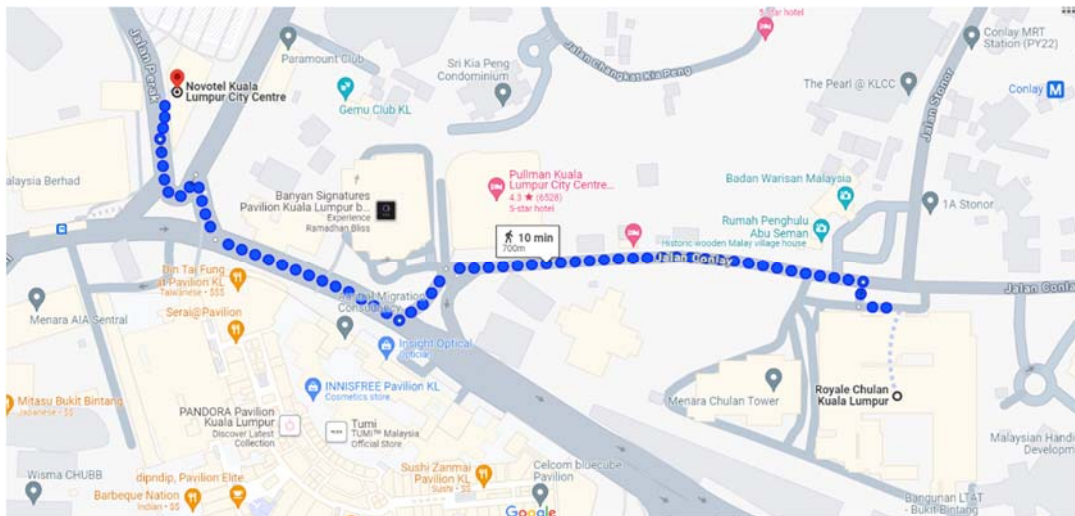
1. Pullman Kuala Lumpur : 3mins walk



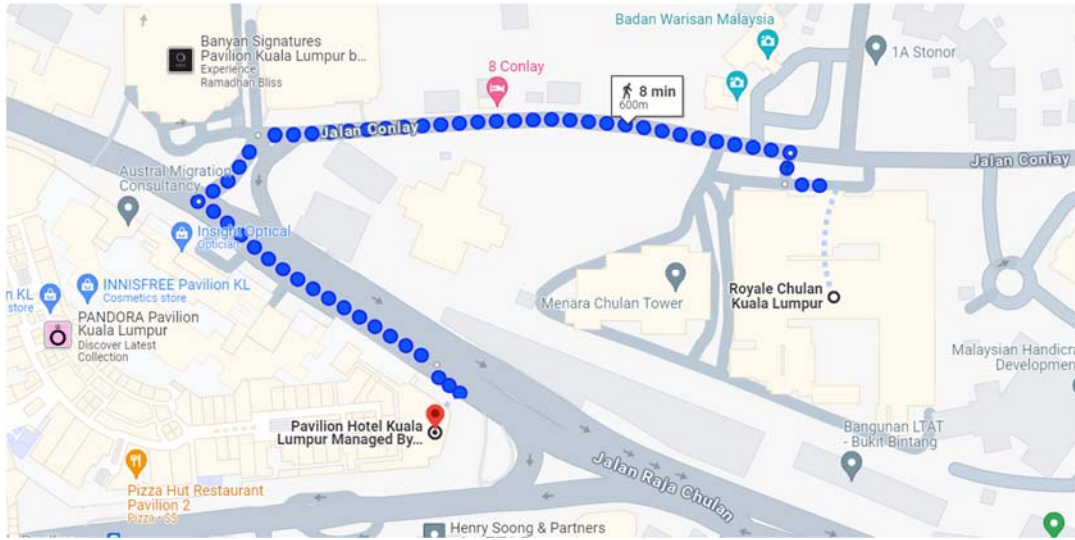
## 2. Dorset Kuala Lumpur : 12mins walk



## 3. Novotel Kuala Lumpur : 10mins walk



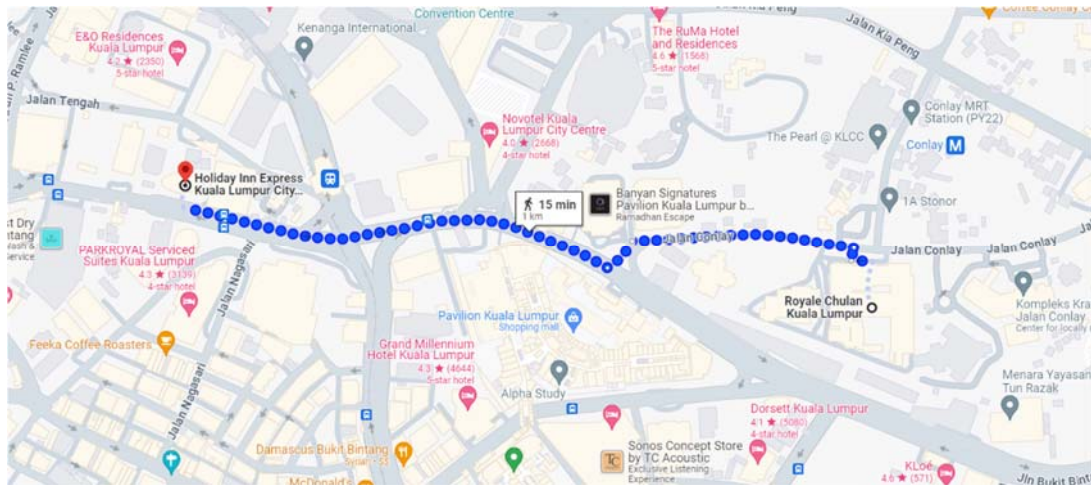
#### 4. Pavilion Kuala Lumpur : 8mins walk

## Air Transport

**International Flights** Kuala Lumpur International Airport (KLIA) is served by several international airlines, including Malaysia Airlines, Air Asia, Batik Air, Singapore Airlines and many more. These airlines offer flights to and from major cities in the region, such as Singapore, Bangkok, Jakarta, Brunei, and many more.

**Airport Facilities** Kuala Lumpur International Airport offers a range of facilities for passengers, including duty-free shops, restaurants and cafes, currency exchange, ATMs, and prayer rooms. Free Wi-Fi is available throughout the airport, and there are also charging stations for electronic devices. Passengers who need assistance can also contact the airport's customer service desk.

## Airport Transport

1. **Taxis** – approximately RM70-80, depending on the time of day and traffic conditions.
2. **Ride-sharing services** (Grab and inDriver) – Travelers can download the app and book a ride from their smartphone. The fare from the KLIA to the city centre is approximately RM65+, depending on the time of day and traffic conditions.
3. **Train** – The KLIA Transit provides a convenient and affordable option for traveller who want to get to the city centre (KL Sentral) using train.

## City Transportation

1. MRT – 2minutes walk from venue. Right side, opposite the venue.
2. Grab – E-hailing company used to get ride like taxi to go anywhere in the city.
3. Trains – Operated by Rapid KL. Touch n Go card is required to use the trains. Please find link below is the transit Map of Rapid KL.
