

Introducing an Award Related to SDGs to replace the Green Broadcast Engineering Award

Introduction

The Green Broadcast Engineering (GBE) Award was instituted in 2011 to recognize, promote and encourage adoption and implementation of energy efficient and environment friendly technologies in the broadcasting industry and broadcasting organisations. In the past 9 years there have been 9 members who have won the award.

The award was established to encourage and promote the use of environment friendly approaches in implementing technology solutions within the membership and industry. The winners in the past has been limited to mostly advanced members, one reason for this could be that new and advanced technologies that support environment friendly features are sometimes more costly and the initial investment is higher compared to more affordable solutions. Another reason could be that we have not promoted enough information about the award and what kind of solutions and implementations are eligible to be nominated for the award.

Sustainable Development Goals

The United Nations 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development comprises of 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) aiming to end poverty and set the world on a path of peace, prosperity and opportunity for all on a healthy planet. It requires action, contribution and support by all stakeholders in all walks of life. It was widely recognised by the UN Member States, at the last SDG Summit, that the global efforts to date have been insufficient to deliver the change needed, jeopardizing the Agenda's promise to current and future generations. Unfortunately, the ongoing global pandemic and its unprecedented effects has further delayed the urgent transition to greener and more inclusive economies and societies, throwing progress on the SDGs even further off track.

Introducing an Award related to SDG Indicators

Introducing an award targeting the areas related to the SDGs could help inform and encourage organisations to consider these areas when upgrading or implementing new facilities and technologies. It can also help promote and educate members on the importance of these areas and the SGD indicators in general.

The Green Broadcast Engineering Award relates to Goal 9 of the SDGs. Introducing an award connected to SDGs would help widen the scope of the award to other relevant areas in addition to the green and environment friendly energy saving solutions referred to in the GBE award. Therefore, replacing the GBE award with an award related to SDGs could in fact help increase more members nominating and participating in the award as it covers more areas.

The SDG indicators document is quite a complex and comprehensive document (full list includes a total of 230 unique indicators) as it is prepared to address all relevant areas of life and livelihood.

Rather than limiting the award to specific goals projects and implementations addressing all 17 goals will be considered for the award.
