Media organisations from different regions will share their work to mainstream DRR actions in organisational policy, news and content and analyse the lessons learned in changing broadcasters attitudes from being mainly reactive to implementing proactive approaches.</i></p>

This session looks at the findings of international research in the context of recent news coverage, and will make clear recommendations to improve reporting on climate change and disaster risk reduction.</i></p>
