

Kuching is the capital city of Sarawak, located in the northwest part of the island of Borneo. With a population of over 700,000 people, it is the largest city in the state and a bustling hub of commerce, culture, and tourism. Climate Kuching has a tropical rainforest climate with high temperatures and humidity year-round.

**Culture and Heritage** Kuching is known for its rich cultural heritage and diverse ethnic communities. Visitors can explore historical landmarks such as the Kuching Waterfront, Fort Margherita, and the Sarawak Museum, which showcases the state's history and culture.

**Food** Kuching is famous for its diverse culinary scene, which offers a mix of Chinese, Malay, and indigenous flavors. Must-try local dishes include Kolo Mee, Sarawak Laksa, and Kueh Chap.

**Location** The Waterfront Hotel Kuching is located on Jalan Tun Abang Haji Openg, on the Kuching Waterfront, just a 5-minute walk from the Tua Pek Kong Temple and the Chinese Museum. The hotel is also a short drive from other popular attractions such as the Sarawak Museum and the Semenggoh Wildlife Centre.



**International Flights** Kuching International Airport is served by several international airlines, including AirAsia, Malaysia Airlines, Singapore Airlines, and SilkAir. These airlines offer flights to and from major cities in the region, such as Singapore, Kuala Lumpur, Bangkok, Hong Kong, and Taipei.

**Domestic Flights** Kuching International Airport is also well-connected to major cities in Malaysia, including Kuala Lumpur, Penang, Johor Bahru, and Kota Kinabalu. Airlines that offer domestic flights to and from Kuching include AirAsia, Malaysia Airlines, Malindo Air, and Firefly.

**Flight Duration** The flight duration to Kuching varies depending on the departure city. Flights from Kuala Lumpur to Kuching take approximately 1 hour and 45 minutes, while flights from Singapore take approximately 1 hour and 50 minutes. Flights from Bangkok take approximately 2 hours and 45 minutes, while flights from Hong Kong take approximately 3 hours and 30 minutes.

**Airport Facilities** Kuching International Airport offers a range of facilities for passengers, including duty-free shops, restaurants and cafes, currency exchange, ATMs, and prayer rooms. Free Wi-Fi is available throughout the airport, and there are also charging stations for electronic devices. Passengers who need assistance can also contact the airport's customer service desk.



Kuching International Airport is located approximately 11 kilometers from the city center of Kuching, and there are several transportation options available for travellers to get to and from the airport. **Taxis** are available outside the arrivals hall and are a convenient option for travellers who want to get to their destination quickly and comfortably. The fare for a taxi ride from the airport to the city center is approximately RM 30-40, depending on the time of day and traffic conditions. **Ride-sharing services** such as Grab and MyCar are also available at the airport. Travelers can download the app and book a ride from their smartphone. The fare for a ride-sharing service from the airport to the city center is approximately RM 15-20, depending on the time of day and traffic conditions. The Kuching Sentral **Airport Shuttle Bus** provides a convenient and affordable option for travelers who want to get to and from the airport. The shuttle bus operates between the airport and Kuching Sentral Bus Terminal, with stops at several locations in the city center. The fare for the shuttle bus is RM 5 per person, and the journey takes approximately 30-45 minutes.
