

COVID guidelines arriving in Delhi (for International)

Travellers arriving in India by flights must follow these guidelines:

- Must submit a self-declaration form on the Air Suvidha website before travelling and include last 14 days of their travel history. Travellers will be liable for criminal prosecution if they give incorrect information regarding their health and travel status.

- On the same portal, must also upload either a valid vaccination certificate (all required doses done) OR a negative COVID-19 RT-PCR test conducted within 72 hours before boarding. Travellers will not be allowed to board if these documents are not uploaded online.
- On arrival, a sub-section (2% of the total passengers on the flight) must undergo random post arrival testing at the airport. They will be allowed to exit the airport once the samples are submitted. If anyone tests positive, they will be treated/isolated as per standard protocol.
- All travellers must also give an undertaking on the portal or otherwise to Ministry of Civil Aviation, Government of India, through concerned airlines before they are allowed to undertake the journey that they would abide by the decision of the appropriate government authority to undergo home/institutional quarantine/ self-health monitoring, as and when warranted.
